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Hyper-geometric Random Variable

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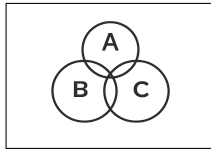


$$N = 5$$

$$K = 2$$

$$n = 2$$

$$k = 1$$

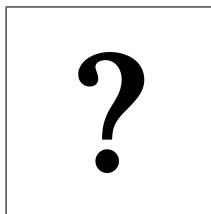


$$P(X = k) = \frac{\binom{K}{k} \binom{N-K}{n-k}}{\binom{N}{n}}$$

$$P(X = 1) = \frac{\binom{2}{1} \binom{3}{1}}{\binom{5}{2}} = \frac{2 \times 3}{10} = \frac{6}{10} = \boxed{0.6}$$

$$E[X] = n \frac{K}{N}$$

$$\text{Var}(X) = n \frac{K}{N} \left(1 - \frac{K}{N}\right) \frac{N-n}{N-1}$$



$$N = 52$$

$$K = 26$$

$$k = 5$$

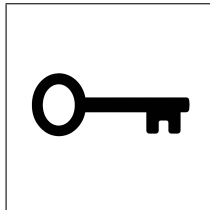
$$n = 2$$

$$P(X = 2) = ?$$

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$$\begin{aligned}N &= 52 \\K &= 26 \\k &= 5 \\n &= 2 \\P(X = 2) &= ?\end{aligned}$$

$$P(X = k) = \frac{\binom{K}{k} \binom{N - K}{n - k}}{\binom{N}{n}}$$

$$P(X = 2) = \frac{\binom{26}{2} \binom{26}{3}}{\binom{52}{5}} = \frac{325 \times 2600}{2,598,960} = \frac{845,000}{2,598,960}$$

$$P(X = 2) \approx \boxed{0.33}$$
